

For Those Wanting to Help with Humanitarian Assistance to Ukraine

The Ukrainian Cultural and Humanitarian Institute (UCHI) in conjunction with the Ukrainian Technological Society of Pittsburgh and New Ukrainian Wave, Pittsburgh Branch compiled this list of organizations which are providing aid to Ukraine during this time of foreign invasion. Each of the organizations listed below is collecting funds to assist Ukrainians with the first four having networks to provide this help and the last two acting as conduits. Each has been fully vetted and is a secure and trusted organization with which our western Pennsylvania Ukrainian-American churches and organizations have long-standing relationships. Each has the status of an accredited non-profit organization registered with the IRS. We have also included a section on non-financial assistance.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

United Ukrainian American Relief Committee, Inc.

With millions of potential victims in Ukraine, UUARC is fundraising to provide vital medical supplies to victims, care for the injured and refugees, as well as shelter and food to those affected.

United Ukrainian American Relief Committee, Inc (UUARC) was established in 1944 and started fulfilling its mission of “brother-to-brother” by assisting Ukrainians in refugee camps during and after WWII, and then helping to resettle more than 70,000 of these refugees in the United States. Since its beginning, UUARC has endeavored to provide aid where the need is the greatest, as well as assisted countless Ukrainians throughout the world. UUARC is working closely with UCCA, UWC, US Aid, and the Ukrainian Embassy in the coordination of aid.

NON-FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in McKees Rocks, PA

Collecting medical supplies and personal items for shipment to Ukrainians in need. Every Sunday from 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM, people may bring the following items to the church at 116 Ella Street in McKees Rocks:

Medicine: Acetaminophen 500 mg tablets

Bandages, sutures, adhesive plasters: Individual sterile dressing package with first aid elastic compression component with protective moisture-resistant shell; sterile gauze bandage 7 m long and 14 cm wide; chemical means for stopping bleeding (hemostatic tamponade bandage with hemostatic agent) – celox or analogue; gel-based occlusive thoracic bandage with or without valve; adhesive plaster on a non-woven basis 3-5 meters long, 2-3 cm wide.

Medical Supplies: Non-sterile nitrile medical examination gloves size L or XL; nasopharyngeal airway and tube with lubricant.

Personal Items: Blue water-proof markers to be used for writing information; scissors for cutting clothes and shoes (atraumatic); polyethylene-based thermal blanket 160 cm wide and 210 cm long; first-aid kit case (medical bag); toothpaste; toothbrushes; wet wipes; soap; men's socks; men's and women's underwear of various sizes; men's t-shirts; metal cups and mugs; dark-colored gloves and mittens for men; cough drops; protein bars.

Medicines: - Paracetamol 500 mg tablets - Meloxicam 7.5 mg tablets - Ciprofloxacin 500 mg or levofloxacin 500 mg tablets

Antibiotics: Zosyn and Unasyn iv, Vancomycin iv - Aspirin - Diphenhydramine/Benadryl - Doxycycline and or Bactrim antibiotics - Fluids, IVF – NSS 09%, LR, d5nss - Gels, foams, hydrocolloids, alginates, hydrogels, and polysaccharide pastes, sutures - Ibuprofen / Advil - Loperamide / Imodium - Miconazole

Medical supplies: - Non-sterile medical nitrile medical examination gloves size L or XL - Means for stopping bleeding mechanical type "CAT" - Nasopharyngeal airway (airway, tube) with

lubricant - Laryngeal tube - Latex or rubber gloves - IV catheters - Mouthpiece for giving CPR - First aid kit case (medical bag) - Antiseptic wipes

Bandages, sutures, adhesive plasters: - Central venous catheter kit - Chest seals - Coban roll, standard 2" x 5 yards - Cravat /triangular bandage, 45"x45"x63 - Dressing materials, include dry or impregnated gauze - Elastic bandages - Elastic wrap / ACE bandage 4"x5yards - Individual sterile dressing package with first aid elastic compression component with protective moisture-resistant shell - Sterile gauze bandage 7 m long and 14 cm wide - Chemical means for stopping bleeding (hemostatic tamponade bandage with hemostatic agent) – Celox or analogue - Gel-based occlusive thoracic bandage with or without valve - Adhesive plaster on a non-woven basis 3-5 meters long, 2-3 cm wide - Hemostatic Bandages - Tourniquet (First Aid) - Butterfly bandages

Miscellaneous: - blue water-proof marker for writing information - Scissors for cutting clothes and shoes (atraumatic) - Polyethylene-based thermal blanket 160 cm wide, 210 cm long - Headlamp
